Occasionally at the end of TV news bulletins, the editors try to include something of a light note, something that can bring a smile to the lips, almost to take away the taste of the bad news that has filled the previous half an hour. The news at present, and generally, is filled with stories of tragedy and disaster; wars, tragic accidents, the victims of crime and human weaknesses and sin, it could make one have a very bleak view of the future.
