Do not be afraid...

Today's Gospel follows on from last weeks, when Jesus sent out his disciples...this week he is giving them words of encouragement, that there is no need to be afraid of those who oppose them, no need to be afraid of standing up for him, no need to be afraid of standing up for what they believe. Probably as they listened, they might become anxious, their enthusiasm tempered by hearing what they might encounter. However what sustains them is not simply the words of encouragement, but the fact that they knew that Jesus would not let them down, that he would be faithful to them, that they were indeed precious to the Father. We pray during Mass, just after the Our Father, to be protected from all anxiety.... it is normal and natural to have anxieties, to have fears of one sort or another, but what Jesus invites us to do is to live by faith, not by terror – we know fear, but we learn to walk straight ahead into the mysterious and blessed dark, where we see the light and love of God. None of us know what tomorrow will bring,
