
FOURTH WEEK OF ADVENT 24TH DECEMBER

Come Lord Jesus come!



SECOND WEEK OF ADVENT 10TH TO 16TH DECEMBER



- Thursday 7th December, in Macclesfield
 - 5:30 6:30pm: Tree of Light Service with Carols and Readings, in the Marketplace
 - 7.30pm: Carol Service in St Alban's Church, led by All Hallows.
- Friday 8th Dec: Feast of The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, celebrated at a Service of Word and Communion at 9:30am in St Paul's Church.
- The **Second Sunday of Advent** in St Paul's Church:
- > Saturday 9th Dec: Vigil Mass at 6:30pm.
- > Sunday 10th Dec: Mass at 10.00am, led by the pupils of St Paul's school, with a celebration of recommitment of the ministries. Mass will be followed by the making of a **Christingle** in the Conservatory for our younger parishioners..

At the heart of our salvation is the love of our faithful God who sent his Son to show us how to be holy. Through his son we are we are graced, enriched and transformed.

So stay awake - do not ignore his calling, or miss his return. Having received all this from his first coming, we should prepare for his second coming by emulating John the Baptist. If you knew for certain that all the royal family were about to walk down your High Street in five minutes time, you would have no qualms about going into every shop and cafe, hurriedly telling everyone. But what about if you'd heard they might be coming. Sometime soon. Would you be a bit more nervous and circumspect? Isaiah tells us to announce God's arrival - with a loud voice, without fear. Do you act as if he is coming, or only that he might be? Come Lord Jesus come!

THIRD WEEK OF ADVENT 17TH TO 23RD DECEMBER

- The Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, in St Paul's Church on:
 - > Saturday 16th Dec: Vigil Mass at 6:30pm.
 - > Sunday 17th Dec: Mass at 10:00am.
- Tuesday 19th Dec: Forgiveness Service at 7:30pm. This service celebrates the meaning of Forgiveness, allowing time for us to repent of those things we know are wrong and ask for God's forgiveness. We are then reconciled, and celebrate God's mercy and our peace of mind that comes with making a fresh start at the beginning of the new year of the Church in Advent.



All are welcome to this ecumenical service.

We have to be patient because we know that God is being patient. But, that's different to being tentative, lukewarm or half-hearted. He is coming; and that changes everything. And the delay is because of the preparation needed, not to postpone it. This Sunday adds the dimension of joy. If we were truly joyful about salvation, we would show it. It is nigh impossible for someone to be happy and not show it, not share it. But we can be like John the Baptist. He prepared the way for the Lord. The Lord came. But then, John doubted. In prison, he felt trapped and in darkness, and wasn't experiencing the promised abundance. Jesus did not tell him off, but merely reminded him what he has seen: the sick are healed; the dead raised and the poor given hope. And he reminded his listeners that, instinctively, we know we have to enter the wilderness to hear the voice of God, and understand the reality of salvation. Come Lord Jesus come!

LITTLE CHURCH - ADVENT PRAYERS AND ANGELS

On each Sunday of Advent in the 10.00am Mass at St Paul's Church, the Little Church group is creating Advent angels that depict Gospel related words or pictures. Little Church will then hang the angels on a tree in church. A basket will be in church for parishioners to add their prayers too. Any children between $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 7 year old are welcome to be at Little Church, which is part of our celebrations at the 10.00am Mass each Sunday.
