#### Parish financial position

Taken from the end of year returns (April 2019)

 Total receipts 2018-19 £50,783.19

(mostly from offertory collections and other regular donations from parishioners £42,043.70)

 Total payments 2018-19 £42,209.01

(mostly non-discretionary running costs of visiting priests, parish office team wages, property expenses)

# Summary In the black (good) But not that much

- For April 2018-19 income receipts are about the same as 2017-18, and we spent less in payments than in 2017-18)
- Diocese needed to top up parish account last week; maybe cash flow.

#### **Community Rooms and Pre-school**

#### Last December

- Arson
- Smoke damage throughout
- Central area burnt out
- Considerable damage to building and contents

#### **Christmas:**

- Considerable support, work and expense
- Lots of thanks to parents, children, wider Poynton community including PHS & Methodist Church, Waitrose, generous donations, parishioners, pre-school team, the fire fighters, Diocese and builders who get building open and start of term
- school ready at start of term with one redecorated room, kitchen and temporary toilets; helped by primary school with toilets

#### Community Rooms and Pre-school

Today



- Over Easter: Remaining considerable effort, work and expense
- Now: Community Rooms and school back to full operation
- Summer break was first holiday break with the Pre-school team as so much work needed.
- Improved the building and garden.

#### Pre-school

- Staff
- Board/committee

#### **Statistics**

- Number of children attendees 16 (increasing after Christmas)
- Numbers change each year, registered for 32 children maximum.
- Now time to advertise preschool: Poynton Post, leaflet new estates ...

#### **Future**

- Very popular pre-school
- Perhaps that needs more space and an building extension, to expand to younger children services (1-2 year age).
- Cannot offer full day care, but could consider offering longer hours.

#### Churches Together in Poynton (CTiP)

- Support the various initiatives of the six Christian churches in Poynton.
- "page 2" in the Poynton Post
- the Easter Cross in St George's
- Special events such as the performance of Gospel Street.
- Would welcome more support in representing St Paul's.

#### **SVP**

- Quietly financial supporting local families in great hardship.
- For example helping some families afford the bus costs to All Hallows school.
- Worthy of your support; via parish office.
- Source of confidential support and advice

### Last year: Buildings

- Created an initial list of jobs and tasks to be done; and adding to all the time
- Replaced floor tiling on front steps
- Replaced and levelled church side path
- Church and presbytery gutters cleared, and checked flat roofs

- Replaced all nave lights with energy low cost LED bulbs
- Keysafes installed for church keys
- Various minor "odd jobs"
- Made contacts with some trusted local tradesmen

### This year: Buildings - internal

- Install new strip of coving in the nave
- Repair damage from leaks and damp in the Piety Stall, Upper Room and the Disabled toilet.
- Plan scope of internal redecorating, probably in 2022-23, to include:
- Fixing PA interference: need full rewiring the altar audio. Will do partial rewiring beforehand.
- Do the pews and kneelers earlier?

### This year: Buildings - external

- Repoint and repair brickwork on church – probably causing internal damp.
- Other building repairs on the church and presbytery.
   E.g. missing flashing may be allowing water ingress.

- Major works (see following slides)
  - Consider options for the ToyBox
  - Consider approach to ground floor toilet in the presbytery.

# Major work - Key points

- Major works need the involvement and authorisation of the Diocese
- There is a Diocese "property" team that manage planning permission and quotes.
- There is a property board that assesses proposals and expenditure budgets.


Example major costs are

- Demolishing the Toybox
- Installing a ground floor
   WC in the presbytery
- Refurbishing the pews and kneelers.

Note that minor refurbishments can be authorised by the parish priest, e.g. replacing the internal coving.


### The Toybox

- Not useable (no water, no sewage, only electricity)
- Currently holding place for items to be disposed of
- Requires very occasional maintenance expenditure
- Asked Diocese Property Dept about demolishing: Diocese handled planning, planning permission and estimates.
   Would provide two extra parking spaces.
- Initial cost estimates were too high for demolition, so considering alternative options.



# Ground floor toilet for presbytery

- Presbytery is increasingly used for parish meetings, social occasions, Little Church, etc
- The WC is upstairs, which is not convenient and not very safe.
- Need to investigate the options for a suitable toilet downstairs.
- Two options: external extension, or using space in the internal building.
- An extension is too expensive, so planning and costing up installation in the rear part of the utility room.
- Need to think whether to proceed at all, or whether some other approach would be a good compromise



#### Church Seating – needs and options

- Kneelers need reupholstering
- Wear on pews has worn through varnish and stain (last treated mid 90s?)
- Better choir and musicians seating layout and amplification
- More space around front – rather congested at funerals





#### Refurbish or replace?

# Refurbish pews and kneelers

- have two estimates
- Cheapest is local suppliers
- Cost to strip and lacquer coat all the pews with kneeler reupholstery is around £18,500

# Replace with equivalent chairs

- have two estimates
- Cheapest is a local supplier
- Wood or metal?
- Kneelers or not?
- Estimate for same number of wooden seats suitable for kneeling is at least £22,500.
- Simpler metal seats nonkneeling estimated at about £5,500.

#### Parish Office team

- Make everything work
- Set up parish personal details database.
- Changed baptism process and forms to be compliant with Diocese requirements.

#### This year – parish organisation

- Parish database needs update to include everybody on rotas and any previously known contacts.
- Further changes to forms and processes to comply with Diocesan advice on GDPR, safeguarding and health & safety.
- Need to ask via St Paul's primary school newsletter for more support of parish activities.

#### Last year - Sacramental and Pastoral

- Eucharistic Ministers taking communion to around 12 people a week
- Friendship and Bereavement Group very popular Little Church well supported with up 12 children attending New missals working well

- 14 Baptisms (Jan–Sep 19)
- 7 funerals (in St Pauls)
- 11 parishioners completed First Holy Communion
- 8 parishioners completed Confirmation programme
- No marriages this year.
- Confessions held in Advent and Lent
- Advertising activities at St Alban's, especially when not being done at St Paul's

#### Sacramental and Pastoral

- Changed catechism training programme (selected by the Diocese)
- Travelling crib will be arranged for Christmas this year
- First Sacraments and Confirmation programme will be held in St Paul's parish in 2020
  - needs extra support.

- Confirmation programme:
  - Meeting Jan
  - Programme starts Feb/Mar
- First sacraments:
  - Children's sessions, Masses of Enrolment and Special Masses will be on Saturday evenings.
  - Celebration of First Reconciliation will be on Sat 29th February 2020
  - Celebration of First Holy Communion will be on Saturday 16th May 2020.
