

Walking on water

Today's gospel is a very symbolic story. The boat going through stormy waters represents the early Church through times of persecution. It also represents the struggle the early Christians had in knowing that the Lord was with them, to see them through the crises they faced.

Peter's struggle between faith and doubt, likewise, was a reflection of the time he had told Jesus he would never deny him, yet when faced with the challenge in the courtyard by the maid servants, he denied he even knew Jesus. Peter's later encounter with the Risen Lord, assured him of the love that Jesus had for him. A love in which he was held secure.

We all have to weather crises in our lives, seemingly having to walk on water; not at all sure of the next step we are going to take, whether we will go under or survive. Jesus tells us to have courage, not to be afraid. Inevitably we will be anxious about many situations; we will not be sure how we will get through. However, as we gather round the altar, we celebrate the reality of the Lord's presence and ask Him to deepen our faith and our trust in his abiding presence at the very heart of our lives.

Feast of the Assumption on Tuesday 15th August 2023 is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Mass Times:- Monday 14th Aug, Vigil at 7:30pm & Tuesday 15th Aug Mass at 9:30am.

The Assumption is the oldest feast day of Our Lady, but we don't know how it first came to be celebrated. Its origin is lost in those days when Jerusalem was restored as a sacred city, at the time of the Roman Emperor Constantine (c. 285-337). By then it had been a pagan city for two centuries, ever since Emperor Hadrian (76-138) had levelled it around the year 135 and rebuilt it as Aelia Capitolina in honour of Jupiter.

For 200 years, every memory of Jesus was obliterated from the city, and the sites made holy by His life, death and Resurrection became pagan temples. After the building of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in 336, the sacred sites began to be restored and memories of the life of Our Lord began to be celebrated by the people of Jerusalem. One of the memories about his mother centred around the "Tomb of Mary," close to Mount Zion, where the early Christian community had lived. On the hill itself was the "Place of Dormition," the spot of Mary's "falling asleep," where she had died. The "Tomb of Mary" was where she was buried. At this time, the "Memory of Mary" was being celebrated. Later it was to become our Feast of the Assumption.
